LORAN-C Station Havre

Commissioned on January 29 1991, it is one of the newest LORAN stations built to enhance air navigation.

Since it's commissioning between 16 April 91 and March 94, LORSTA Havre has received five 180 day transmit awards and fifteen 100% baseline awards with a availability of 99.974%

LORSTA HAVRE is remotely controlled from the control station located in Middletown, California, enabling one crew member to handle malfunctions after normal working hours. The five assigned crew members conduct routine maintenance and repairs.


