ARTICLE 9, SUBPARAGRAPH D(4): U.S. CLARIFIED "CAPACITS OF SYSTEM" AS DEARING ON DETERMINATION OF WHAT MIGHT BE MADE AVAILABLE FOR TURKISH USEJM TURKS SUGGESTED THAT U.S. DID NOT NEED "TAKING INTO ACCOUNT..."
