1. Informal discussions were held this date between U. S. Embassy, Philippine Navy and USCG representatives concerning continued requirements by the Government of the Republic of the Philippines (GOP).

2. In attendance were:

Mr. Frazier Meade, Counselor of Embassy for Political Affairs.
CAPT R. C. EVANS, USN, Naval Attache and Naval Attache for Air.

nical Assistance Detail, Manila.

- 3. Discrepancies concerning annex identification between enclosure (1) to reference (a) and (b) as clarified in reference (c) were pointed out by Commanding Officer, LORTAD. The Philippine Navy representative then informed that the annexes referred to in reference (a) were not the annexes attached to the Memorandum of Agreement (reference (b)) as was previously understood by the U. S. Embassy and USCG. U. S. Representatives were then allowed to copy the annexes referred to, which formed a part of a GOP document that had not previously been transmitted to either the U. S. Embassy or USCG. These annexes are attached as enclosure (1).
- 4. The Philippine Navy representatives advised that the original GOP request (enclosure (1) to reference (a)) will not be withdrawn as requested by the U. S. Embassy (reference (d)), however only items a, b, and c need be dealt with.
- 5. Mr. Meade advised CAPT VELASCO that due to this new development concerning the GOP's clarification of their request, he would have to review it and arrange for another informal meeting at a later date.

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- 6. Mr. Meade expressed concern that presently the USCG LORTAD personnel have no formal, written authority to be in the Republic of the Philippines and therefore it is of the utmost importance that an agreement be forged as soon as possible and preferably prior to the end of March 1975 in order to protect U. S. Government interests.
- 7. Mr. Meade requested the Commanding Officer, LORTAD to submit to him comments on this clarified request by the GOP prior to 11 March 1975.
