Dear Mr. Lane,

With further reference to your letter of 12th June Serial 034, regarding the construction of a Loran Station at Atafu Island in the Union Group, I have to inform you that information has been received that advance United States construction personnel who are visiting the island from time to time - no doubt to make arrangements for the reception of the main party when they arrive - are bringing in quantities of trade goods and engaging in trade with the Natives.

You will recall that in paragraph 12 of enclosure (b) with your note under reference it was stated that every effort would be made to prevent any interference with the Native mode of living.

You will realize that there is a small tariff on goods which are imported through normal trade channels and, while the total revenue is not of major consequence, it is desired that trade should be restricted to the normal channels.

In all the circumstances it is suggested that your authorities might be willing to take such action as they may consider appropriate in regard to trading by United States Service personnel.

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
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BETAILS OF PROPOSED INSTALLATION - ATAFU ISLAND

Loudin - LAT 80 32 09 5 LONG 1720 31 120 W


This is a point on the north shore of the island in a large group of coconst trees, approximately one half sile northeast of the village.

- 2. <u>Installation</u> will consist of 7 Quenset huts, each 20° x 48° in size which, together with necessary entennes masts and ground systems, will require a plot of ground 900° x 900° in size.
- 3. <u>Clearing necessary</u> it will be necessary to remove approximately three hundred eccount palms at the site. (See paragraph 13.)
- 4. Interference there will be no distinguace to existing installation other than the necessary removal of trees. He interference with the native radio station is anticipated.
- 5. Governmentions will furnish own.
- 6. Mater and Supplies will furnish own.
- 7. Rouinment will furnish own construction equipment.
- 8. Assistance in clearing site will be requested of native population Suitable recompense for purvises will be made.
- 9. Sewage will dispose into sea.
- 10. Landing on west side of island about opposite village. He read messary from landing to site.
- 11. Security site will be fenced.
- 12. Personnel have been earefully selected, and every effort will be sade to prevent any interference with the native mode of living. Personnel stationed personnelly at the site will consist of twenty-six men under the command of a U. S. Goast Guard Officer. During the construction period (estimated at two months) there will be an additional fourteen men and one officer on the island.

- 2. It is approved policy not to disturb the native economy beyond the degree required by the necessity of war.
- 3. It is approved policy not to permit direct commerce between the natives and occupying forces.
- 4. Imports into British territory of goods for commercial use are subject to local tariffs.
- 5. To the extent practicable and for the reasons set forth in paragraphs 1, 2, and 3, commercial transactions between the natives and our forces should be on the basis of satisfactory arrangements between the proper British authorities and commanding officers, United States Forces.
