CWO4 Jesus Mesa

Chief Warrant Officer Jesus Mesa, from Bensenville, Illinois, enlisted in the U. S. Coast Guard in 1972.

Chief Warrant Officer Mesa has served as Commanding Officer of Coast Guard LORAN Station Attu, Alaska since 6 July 1999. His next assignment is Supervisor at Electronics Support Detachment, Portsmouth, Virginia.

Chief Warrant Officer Mesa's past assignments include Sensor/Navigation Projects Officer at MLCLANT, Norfolk, VA; Loran Engineering Projects Officer at ACTEUR, London, England; Standard Workstation II Database Manager at TISCOM, Alexandria, VA; Executive Officer and Senior Technical Officer at LORSTA Iwo Jima, Japan; Chief Electronics Technician at LORSTA Carolina Beach, NC and aboard WHEC-724 MUNRO; Electronics Technician aboard WHEC-725 JARVIS, Instructor at AN/SRC-21 "C" School at TRACEN Governor's Island, NY; and Electronics Technician aboard WHEC-722 USCGC MORGENTHAU. He is a graduate of USN Cryptographics "C" School and USCG Electronics "A" School.

Chief Warrant Officer Mesa's awards include a Coast Guard Commendation Medal, Commandant's Letter of Commendation (2 awards), Unit Commendation, Meritorious Unit Commendation, Meritorious Team Commendation (4 awards), Good Conduct Award (4 awards), National Defense Medal (2 awards) and Restricted Duty Service.

CWO2 Robert Manning

Chief Warrant Officer Robert Manning was born in Boston, Massachusetts in 1959. He enlisted in the U. S. Coast Guard in 1977.

Chief Warrant Officer Manning's past afloat assignments include Electronics and Electrical Assistant on Icebreaker POLAR SEA, WAGB-11, Seattle, Washington; ET Shop Supervisor on Cutter LEGARE WMEC-912, Portsmouth, Virginia; Lead Technician on Icebreaker GLACIER, WAGB-4, Long Beach, California & Portland, Oregon; Communications Technician on Cutter STEADFAST, WMEC-623, St Petersburg, Florida; and the Deck Force on the Cutter SHERMAN, WHEC-720, Boston, Massachusetts.

Chief Warrant Officer Manning's shore assignments include Executive Petty Officer and Officer in Charge at Recruiting Office Tacoma in Washington; Tiger Team Leader at Telecommunications and Information Systems Command, Alexandria, Virginia; and Field Technician at Station Castle Hill, Newport, Rhode Island.

Chief Warrant Officer Manning's awards include the Coast Guard Achievement Medal (4 awards), Commandant's Letter of Commendation, Unit Commendation (4 awards), Meritorious Unit Commendation (5 awards), Good Conduct Award (6 awards), National Defense Medal and the Antarctic Service Medal (4 awards).

CG LORAN Station Attu

In 1943, LORAN operations were established with the first Loran-A station at Theodore Point. In 1947, Loran-A operations were relocated to Casco Cove. In 1960, the station was again relocated to the former Navy weather observatory building. This is our present site, overlooking Massacre Bay. Loran-C operations were also started that year. In July of 1979, Loran-A operations were discontinued on Attu.

Loran station Attu serves as the X-ray secondary transmitting station for the North Pacific Loran chain. In 1991, Attu became a dual-rated station for the Russian American loran chain. Attu is currently the only Coast Guard loran station that is part of a foreign chain.

Attu is the western most island of the Aleutian Islands. It is one of the three remaining isolated, restricted duty Loran stations, all of which are in Alaska. Of the three stations, Attu is the most remote and most isolated loran station. It has no Native Population and relies strictly on Coast Guard Air Station Kodiak for logistics supplies provided every two weeks. These logistics flights, a focal point for the crew, are the station's only tie with the rest of the world for mail, food, supplies, and travel to and from the island. Attu, part of the Aleutian Island Wildlife Refuge, and the areas of fighting during the battle of Attu, earned a listing in the National Register of Historic Places in 1985.
