Report of Meeting with Major James ESPING, USAF regarding Attu

Ref : (a) Comdt MSG 052602Z MARCH 1965

1. Reference (a) directs CCGDL7 to investigate the Air Force's interest in establishing a facility at Attu. I met with Major ESPING at Elmendorf on 11 March. He will come to Juneau probably ~~next~~ ^{this} week for further discussions.

2. Preliminary information follows.

a. "AFTAC" is Air Force Technical Applications Center. Their proposed mission on Attu is classified while the fact that they are moving in is UNCLAS.

b. A permanent installation is planned; i.e., at least 5 years.

c. There will be no AF transmitting - only passive equipment.

d. Personnel - 5 planned. Senior AF man will be SGT. Berthing and messing facilities required.

e. Equipment - Remote equipment will be located in old tunnel. Power and data transmission lines (on poles) will connect remote equipment with manned equipment in CG building. Need about 600 sq. feet of floor space in CG building for equipment. Also need space for desk and filing cabinet.

f. Power requirement - 5 to 15 Kw.

g. Communications - No classified traffic. Maybe 6 or so messages per day, including all administrative and ops traffic. If CG communications cannot support their operation they will effect required improvements.

h. Construction - AF plans to:

Fix road, including bridge

Fix tunnel and entrance

Construct power and data lines on poles to tunnel

Take care of any required work in CG building

\$500,000 tentatively planned for above work. (Apparently no shortage of money for this project.)

1. In accordance with reference (a) discussions have been held with Major James ESPING, USAF, Detachment 203, Elmendorf Air Force Base, relative to stationing an Air Force Detachment at Attu Loran Station. This detachment will consist of five enlisted technicians. Approximately 600 square feet of operational space, ten kilowatts electrical power, berthing, messing, and associated support for the five man detail have been requested. Air Force plans call for the construction of a five mile power line to a remote equipment site and repairs to a road running to the remote site.

2. The Air Force installation will be passive in nature and will not interfere with the loran equipment. Some modification of the Coast Guard building at Attu will be necessary to accommodate the Air Force. Funds for such an alteration will be provided by the Air Force. Technical equipment will be maintained by their own personnel. Building repairs, maintenance of one vehicle, communications, logistic and other support services will be performed by the Coast Guard on a reimbursable basis.

3. The plan for an Air Force detachment on Attu is feasible and is compatible with loran operations. The Coast Guard services requested can be performed without increase in equipment or personnel. The following course of action is recommended:

a. Commander 17th District submit a StructAlt for the modification of the Attu building to accommodate the Air Force.

b. Commander 17th District negotiate an agreement with the Alaska Air Command to cover the cost of this StructAlt.

c. A support agreement be executed between the Alaska Air Command and the 17th Coast Guard District for the reimbursement for Coast Guard services at Attu.

1. Basement berthing as proposed by reference would not be acceptable due to noise and distance from toilet facilities.
2. Room 26 still appears the best placement for the Air Force personnel. However, the District concurs with your comments on Room #13 (Reference (b)).
3. These two possibilities remain for berthing the 3 displaced Coast Guard men:
 - a. Two in Room 14, one in dormitory space. (3 men to a room as you are now doing in 2 rooms)
 - b. Move all three to the dormitory space or to other 2 man rooms, 3 men per room.
4. To ease the disruption, the last three men you anticipate receiving prior to the arrival of Air Force personnel (of which time you will be notified) should be diverted to the new berthing arrangement which choice, 3a or 3b, is left to you.

Subj: Air force facility at Attu.

1. On 1 July Major Esping called and offered the following information regard to Attu.

a. ~~The requested~~ The air force activity is scheduled to become operational on 15 Aug 1965.

The Air Force plans to send a 15 to 20 man M and R group out to Attu about 15 July. It should take about 3 weeks to complete their work. The A.F. will bring in lumber, materials and lumber. ~~Food and bathing space~~ The base station is requested to provide food and ~~bathing space for~~ ~~the~~ ~~base~~ ~~area~~. One A.F. mess cook will be provided.

c. The A.F. operation order specifies that the ~~last~~ C₆ requires the last 500 feet of cable to be buried. Major Esping requested this requirement be waived for the temporary installation.

d. The operational space is a controlled area and the A.F. wants this area partitioned off. ~~The A.F. will not do this~~ With our permission the A.F. will erect the partitioning following the general decoum of the rest of the building.

e. Major Esping stated that Washington has asked the temporary A.F. detail be enlarged to 4 men in lieu of the 3 previously agreed upon. Major Esping had advised his superior ~~that~~ that this was unacceptable. However he did wish to inform us of the pressure in this direction.

f. The Air Force material would be staged at ~~Shenyang~~ Shenyang. A C-124 would be routed to Shenyang and provide shuttle service during the construction period.

2. The several staff branches involved were contacted in regard to Major Espang's proposal and the following information elicited.

a. There is no objection to having the cables on the ground leading into the station.

b. The station can support the AF M&R crew on an informal "camp out" basis.

c. There is no objection to AF installing a partition in the cellar operational space.

d. The increase to a 4 man detail is undesirable encroachment on CG living space and should be resisted.

3. The C.O., Alton, Iowa Station was contacted who on their proposal. He was already ~~was~~ generally aware of the Air Force requirements and felt the station could provide the required support. He was requested information as to how to change the curfew members of the AF crew for meals and substance. ~~The Capt~~
~~The Capt~~ The ~~Complete~~ ~~will send~~ ~~amplify~~ This was relayed to F who will send Alton amplifying instructions on this point.

4. Major Espry was called and advised that his plan was acceptable to the CG and we would support the AF to the limit of our capabilities.

Prior to the arrival of the permanent AF detachment local operational standards were arrived at jointly between the CO and senior AF installation man. Among their agreements arrived at was that the AF vehicles would not be used for recreation. At that time there were two Dodge six passenger pick-ups at the station, one was to be shipped out at the first chance.

Against this agreement and without notifying the CO or XO the newly arrived permanent men took the vehicle to be returned and were approximately eight miles from the station when a C-124 stopped at Attu to return the AF equipment. The road to the valley they had gone into was not deemed suitable for government vehicle use. The result was the truck remains at Attu.

^{Reply (if required)}
When informed of the previous agreement the permanent detachment personnel wrote to Det. 243. The contents of the letter are not known, but the result was reference B. Reference B clarifies the status of AF vehicles. There has been absolutely no interference with their use of vehicles for work purposes and will be no interference with recreational use in the future.

As the engineering department work load is great (have been under compliment since spring) all repairs necessitated by recreational use will be on a deferred basis.



Reference is made to Invitation for Bid E8095-507-66-72 for Operations Facility, Attu.

Enclosure (1) is a copy of letter received from Walsh & Co. concerning this project. The following information is furnished in reply to the questions raised, so that it may be furnished to all prospective bidders, if desired.

A. The present Attu docks are in unusable condition as either the shore terminals have collapsed or are in unsafe condition. Beach landing of equipment and materials will be required.

B. The North-South runway has been closed to aircraft operations due to a collapsed culvert and due to damages to the Runway Bridge across Peaceful River. The East-West runway has a 3500 ft. usable length of runway. Reeves Aleutian Airways presently provides commercial air service to Attu. No landing fees charged.

C. A maximum of four Contractor's personnel can be provided subsistence and quarters for a maximum period of six days during the Contractor's initial move-in. Subsistence will be available at a cost of \$2.50/day/man. Quarters will be available without charge.

D. No Coast Guard equipment is available.

E. Small quantities of gas, diesel oil and lube oil are available on an emergency basis only. Moaa Lisa Fuel resupply is scheduled for 26 July 1966.

F. The Coast Guard Station can provide limited service in sending or receiving telegrams to or from the nearest commercial communications facility at no cost. This service will be provided as Coast Guard operations permit.

SUPPORT AGREEMENT BETWEEN
THE ALASKAN AIR COMMAND
AND
THE ALASKAN SEA FRONTIER FOR SUPPORT OF
U. S. AIR FORCE DETACHMENT 208
AT
NAVAL STATION, ADAK, ALASKA

SECTION I - PURPOSE:

This agreement is to establish the policies and procedures under which the Naval Station, Adak, will provide logistic support to the Alaskan Air Command (U. S. Air Force Detachment 208).

SECTION II - AGREEMENT:

It is herein agreed that the Alaskan Air Command (U. S. Air Force Detachment 208, 1 officer and 13 airmen), a tenant unit at Adak will be furnished facilities, administrative and logistical support as outlined in AFR 172-3/SECNAVINST 7020.4A dated 10 June 1960 and AFM 172-1, as amended.

It is agreed that the Navy activity responsible for support of the Alaskan Air Command (U. S. Air Force Det 208) is the Commanding Officer, Naval Station, Adak, Alaska.

It is agreed that the AAC and U. S. Air Force Det 208 activity to be supported is the Air Force personnel stationed at Adak in a tenant status.

It is understood that statements throughout the agreement, wherein the Commanding Officer, Naval Station, Adak, Alaska, assumes responsibility for providing supplies, equipment, facilities, and services are not intended to modify or waive the provisions of AFR 172-3/SECNAVINST 7020.4A regarding the respective responsibilities of Host and Tenant for budgeting and funding.

It is understood that all reimbursable services, equipment, supplies and facilities furnished by the Commanding Officer, Naval Station, Adak, Alaska, will not be collected directly from the U. S. Air Force Det 208, but will be billed monthly on SF 1080 documents, with supporting evidence of receipt, to the Alaskan Air Command Accounting and Finance Office, Elmendorf Air Force Base, for reimbursement.

SECTION III - REVIEW OR AMENDMENTS:

The terms of this agreement are subject to change by written notification mutually agreed to by the Commander, Alaskan Air Command, and the Commander, Alaskan Sea Frontier or their designated representatives.

As herein used, the term "Host Activity" shall mean the Commanding Officer, Naval Station, Adak, Alaska, and the term "Tenant Activity" shall mean the AAC (U. S. Air Force Det 208). Terms of this agreement will be reviewed periodically, at least once annually. Following such reviews, the agreement will be amended as required to reflect actual and forecast future operating conditions.

SECTION IV - APPROVAL:

The terms of this agreement are effective upon final approval by Headquarters, Alaskan Air Command and Headquarters, Alaskan Sea Frontier.

Budget and reimburse for supplies, services and facilities as outlined in AFR 172-3/SECNAVINST 7020.4A in consonance with basic policies for inter-service support.

Commissary

Provide this service on the same basis as for Navy personnel.

Non applicable.

Communications

Provide and maintain existing trunk lines for internal communications. Local lines and equipment required in Air Force operating areas will be provided and maintained by the host. Provide teletype service on a common user basis.

Furnish or arrange for specialized communications services. Reimburse the host as outlined in AFR 172-3/SECNAVINST 7020.4A and AFM 172-1 as amended.
