SUBJECT: Lampedusa, Italy, Coast Guard Project.

1. The understanding of the Corps of Engineers is that the Italian Government will formally advise in writing that land necessary for construction at Lampedusa, Italy is now made available and at the same time will assure the U.S. Government that it will exonerate U.S. Government from any third party claims. We assume that this will be coupled with an undertaking by the Italian Government to complete all necessary steps to amend existing agreements and to carry out the expropriation process. With the concurrence of the State Department through the Rome Embassy we see no reason to question land ownership on the above basis.

2. Upon receipt of confirming documentation and necessary funding, this office will be in a position to proceed.

LAMPEDUSA, ITALY LAND EXPROPRIATION AND EASEMENT REQUEST FOR

U R G E N

USCG LORAN-C STATION

- 1. Land to be appropriated is that on the west end of the Island of Lampedusa, within the boundary lines delineated by monuments #012, 011, 02, 03, 04, 05, 06, 08, 09 and 01 and the Mediterranean Sea, as shown on USCG LORAN-C STATION Drawing No. 999-001 dated 4 October 1971.
- Easement for continued use and possible improvement of the communal road between the LORAN Station and the town of Lampedusa.
- 3. Easement for relocation of communal road between the LORAN Station and the navigation light on the extreme west end of the Island of Lampedusa.
- 4. Easement on communal land for a sea water pipeline and electric power cable between the LORAN Station and the base of Ravine Profondo, including a sea water suction facility at the base of Ravine Profondo.
- 5. Construction "Right-of-Entry", including release from 3rd party claims, to be granted as soon as possible.
