0	The Coast Guard cognizant real property of LORSTA OCEAN CAPE consists of improvements only. The land is being used on a Use Permit dated 7/26/50 from the U. S. Forest Service and provides for 520 acres. Buildings and other structures for housing, storage, utility systems, communication systems, navigation aid as well as roadways have been accumulated since 1951. The buildings contain 12,336 square feet of floor space. There are billets for one office, ten enlisted and two civilians at the Station. The total accumulative cost of improvements is \$1,001,000. Considering the amount of investment, it appears highly desirable to seek a transfer of property accountability. The station personnel have no conception of the real property status.
