Subj: Motion picture shows; attendance by natives and other civilians
in the area

1. It has been brought to the attention of this command that the practice of allowing natives and other civilians in the Yakutat area to attend movies at this unit may be undesirable.
2. This practice has evidently been in effect for some length of time with no difficulties being experienced. Persons attending the movies arrive from fifteen to twenty minutes before the showing and depart at the conclusion. No objectionable behavior whatsoever has been observed by this officer since arriving at this unit.
3. The privilege of attending movies at this unit is very much appreciated by the local residents. In the past when there have been delays in the circuit the absence of movies seems to have been as much, if not more, of a concern to them than the personnel at the station.
4. In view of the foregoing it is requested that this unit be advised as to whether this practice is in conflict with any Headquarters or District policies.
