Subj: Transfer of Command, USCG LORSTA Sitkinak Island, Alaska

- 1. As of this date I relieve LTJG Donald R DICKMANN 8808, USCG, as Commanding Officer of USCG Loran Station Sitkinak, Alaska.
- 2. The Electronics department has no apparent discrepancies and equipment is operating well. On board personnel are below the authorized levels -- four ET3's are filling the billits of an ET1, two ET2's an ET3 and an ETN. Present personnel are competent but have no back up personnel and replacement by non-Loran experianced technicians will adversely affect the operation of this unit. Of all the Electronics personnel only one has had a prior Loran tour (Loran-A). A formal training program for the

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technicians is established but most training is concentrated on Loran-C to meet operational requirements. The ERPAL is up to date with the exception of minor deficincies in stocked supplies which do not adversely impair the unit's mission.

- 3. A joint inventory of the exchange was conducted and a relief report prepaired in conjunction with the regular March 73 report. A minor bookkeeping error was made on the previous report which affected exchange profits making the previous month's profit high and the following month's low. But averaged together they reflect the expected normal profit percentage. No corrected report for February 1973 has been prepaired as it is believed that the letter of explanation required for a marked change in profits by the Comptrollers Manual, that has been forwarded with the March Exchange report, will suffice.
- 4. Inventories and inspections were also conducted for the commissary, narcotics and alcohol, classified material and small arms. All are in good order and provided adequate security.
- 5. All Title B property is accounted for. Minor allowence list shortages exist and some items require refurbishing, but station operation is not adversely affected.

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
